


# **KEY FACTS**

- Catholic education has been part of the Western Australian community for over 180 years.
- #2 1 in 3 children in Western Australia is educated in a non-Government school, and 1 in 5 in a Catholic school.
- Catholic schools in Western Australia provide an education to nearly 82,000 children across the State in 162 diverse schools, including 7 locations across the Kimberley region where we are the sole education provider.
- Each of these children is entitled to a state education, but because they are educated in Catholic schools, the WA Government saves in excess of \$600 million\* each year.
- #5 If Catholic schools ceased to operate the WA
  Government would need to spend more than
  \$5 billion in additional capital expenditure to
  replace these schools across the State.
- #6 No child is ever denied a place in a Catholic school due to the inability of their parents to pay school fees. Many of our parents receive significant fee relief including automatic fee discounts for concession card holders.
- #77 Catholic schools welcome children from diverse abilities, backgrounds, faiths, and cultures. We educate over 7,000 children with a disability and nearly 4,000 First Nations students.
- #8 Western Australia is the only State in Australia which does not provide any capital grant assistance to non-Government schools.

# **Happy Families**

#### Parenting With Influence Not Control - Dr Justin Coulson

One morning, a farmer was doing chores in front of his farmhouse when a large four-wheel drive pulled into his driveway. A man in a uniform climbed out, walked up to the farmer, and declared, "I'm here to inspect your farm for any illegally grown drugs."

The farmer responded, "Fine. But whatever you do, do not go into that paddock over there." He pointed to a beautiful paddock behind the man.

The officer, bristling with authority, replied, "Mate, I don't think you understand. I'm here to inspect your farm and I have the authority of the state government – the premier – behind me." He reached into his pocket and pulled out a badge. "Do you see this badge? It means I can go onto any land I want! Have I made myself clear?"

The farmer apologised and resumed his chores. A short while later, the farmer heard a scream. He looked toward the paddock and saw the officer racing across it with a raging bull in hot pursuit.

Seeing the imminent danger, the farmer stepped onto the fence surrounding the paddock and called out, "Your badge! Show him your badge!"

#### The Badge of Authority

As parents, we often find ourselves in the same predicament as the officer. We believe that our authority should compel our children to comply, but just like the bull, they are unimpressed by our badges. We say things like, "Because I'm the parent, that's why," and expect obedience. When our children resist, we escalate, relying on our power to enforce compliance.

But this approach is flawed. H.L. Mencken said, "There's always a well-known solution to every human problem – neat, plausible, and wrong." This is especially true in parenting. Our simplistic strategies for "fixing" our children often create bigger challenges. Children need to know we have power, but that power should make them feel secure, not controlled.

When our children don't listen, we get mad. We yell, threaten, remove privileges, ground, and some parents even resort to physical punishment. But these actions ignore the reasons behind their behaviour and damage our relationship with them. They might comply in the short term, but they're learning to fear us, not to understand right from wrong.

Relying on our authority, our parenting "badge," diminishes our real influence. Children might obey while we're watching, but the moment we turn our backs, our authority evaporates. Instead, we need to focus on building relationships of trust. This slow, deliberate approach might seem less effective at first, but it yields long-term results.

#### The Three Es of Effective Discipline

If we really want to help our children, we do it best by working with them rather than doing things to them or simply issuing commands. To help, I've developed the 3 Es of Effective Discipline: Explore, Explain, and Empower.

When we explore, we spend time together, connecting. When we understand where our child is struggling, we move to explain.

When we explain, we keep it short and simple. Most of the time our children already know what is expected. So we restate, "You know, and I know, that hitting your siblings is not ok. We're always working on managing our feelings and asking for help if we need it."

Then, assuming they feel understood and we know they get our expectations loud and clear, we empower. This does not mean we let them decide what should happen. It means we invite their ideas on how to move forward, and offer gentle collaboration and guidance to help them figure things out. It might mean they apologise to someone who's been hurt, make restitution for something lost, broken, or stolen, or simply promise to do better next time.

Power struggles are an inevitable part of parenting. Toddlers fight over bedtime, screen time, or what to wear. Teenagers push back against curfews and household rules.

Parenting with influence, not control, requires patience, empathy, and a willingness to understand our children's perspectives. By setting aside our badges of authority and embracing the Three Es of Effective Discipline, we can navigate the challenges of parenthood with grace and effectiveness, fostering a nurturing environment where our children can thrive.



#### St John's - First Aid Focus Incursion

We were lucky to have St John's WA provide students with a **First Aid Focus Incursion** during their Health lessons. All students from Kindy up to Year 6 took part. The incursion was run by the St John's WA community education officers and was designed to equip our students with the skills needed to make safe decisions, manage risk, and take action to promote the health and safety of themselves and others around them.

Thank you to Mrs Gerhardy for organising such an interesting and important incursion.

Here is an outline of what the different year groups learned:

#### Kindergarten - Pre-primary

Through a storybook and with the aid of Kura the Bear, students learned how to identify an emergency, what number to call and understand the role of who can help in an emergency.

#### Year 1 & 2

Students learned how to recognise a Danger, how to get someone to Respond accordingly and when to Send for help in an emergency. At the end of the session students were able to understand what an emergency is and how to recognise an ambulance and a paramedic.

#### Year 3 - 5

Students learned how to identify, practise and develop their skills. The focus for the students is to assess the casualties' condition, check their airways and breathing, and how to place the casualty into the recovery position.

#### Year 6

Students learned how to treat a casualty who is unconscious and not breathing normally. The demonstrations reinforced the message of staying safe and seeking help quickly in an emergency.

# Did you know we have a 3-Year-Old Kindy? Enrolments are now open for 4 Year old Kindergarten for 2025 and 2026



We are now accepting enrolments for kindy for 2025 and 2026. Make sure you get enrolment forms in as soon as possible as positions are limited and interviews for the 2025 intake have commenced.

If your child was born between **1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021** they will start 4 Year Old Kindergarten at the beginning of **2025**. If your child was born between **1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022** they will start 4 Year Old Kindergarten in **2026**.

# **School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI)**

The Australian Government has launched the School Student Broadband Initiative to provide free home internet for one year for up to 30,000 unconnected Australian families with school- aged students.

The program is available to all students who lack an active nbn connection at home. Families can register until **Dec 2024**.

To be eligible, families must:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school.
- Not have an active National Broadband Network (nbn®) Internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.
- Live in a home that can access the National Broadband Network via a standard connection this will be checked for you.

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
