Inappropriate iPad Use:

- Wrong app at the wrong time
- Unsafe physical use of IPad (e.g. running, throwing/dropping)
- Messaging others
- Inappropriate use of camera (including selfies/rapid shots)
- Airdropping and receiving air drops without teacher permission
- Changing your iPad name (use your full name with no emojis)
- Not using the app appropriately (e.g. collaboration spaces)
