

## **Noongar Seasons Task**



## Kaya parents

Students have recently been given an activity during their Auslan lessons relating to the six Noongar seasons.

Each year group has been assigned one of the six Noongar seasons. They have been tasked to create a poster that visually represents their season. The poster contains pictures only, except for the name of their season. All posters are to be drawn on A4 paper in portrait orientation.

Here are some details about each of the seasons that will help with this project. I have included, main colours and pictures to include in each season.

## Bunuru (Year 6)

Bunuru is the hottest part of the year, with little to no rain

Life was traditionally lived by the coast

The hot easterly winds continue until the sea breeze in the afternoon

Mainly a freshwater and seafood diet including fish

There are lots of white flowering gums including Jarrah, Marri and Ghost Gums.

The Zamia cones start to turn from green to red

**COLOURS – WHITE** 

PICTURES – HOT SUN, COAST (BEACH), FISH, WHITE FLOWERS, ZAMIA PLANT WITH CONES.

## Djeran (Year 4)

There is finally a break in the really hot weather

Cool nights with dewy mornings

There are many flying ants cruising in the light winds

This is the season for red flowers, especially the red flowering gums and also the more petite flowers of the Summer Flame

A red rusty colour appears through the bark of the Sheoaks and seed cones also appear.

Banksias start to flower – this is a great food source for birds and small animals

Traditionally food sources would be seeds and bulbs and freshwater animals like fish, frogs and turtles.

Towards the end of Djeran, there may be some cool rainy days

COLOURS - RED

PICTURES – FLYING ANTS, LIGHT WIND, RED FLOWERING GUMS, BANKSIA FLOWERS, FISH, FROGS AND TURTLES

#### Makuru (Pre-Primary and Year 1)

Makuru is the coldest, wettest time of the year.

Karla (fire) is the centre of the home

Waterways and catchments fill up and so moving around Noongar Country is easier

Food source changes to land grazing animals like Kangaroos

Animals start pairing up – Wardong (crow), Maali (Black Swan)

Blue and Purple flowers are more visible (Blueberry Lilly and Purple Flags)

Towards the end of Makuru, the white flowers of the Weeping Peppermint start to appear.

COLOURS - BLUE AND PURPLE

PICTURES – CROWS (PAIR), BLACK SWAN (PAIR), PURPLE AND BLUE FLOWERS, KANGAROO, RAIN AND FIRE

#### Djilba (Year 3)

Yellow and cream flowers start exploding across Noongar Country

Food source is still Yongka (kangaroo), Weitj (emu) and Koomal (possum)

Some cold, clear days mixed with warmer, rainy days

As days warm up we start to hear new borns foraging with parents.

Woodland birds are still nest bound, Koolbardi (Magpie), djidi djidi (Willy wagtail), Chuck-a-luck (Wattle birds) start to swoop.

As the temperature rises, we start to see the stalk of the Balga (Grass Tree)

COLOURS - YELLOW AND CREAM

PICTURES – LOTS AND LOTS OF YELLOW FLOWERS, CLOUDS AND SUN, BIRDS IN A NEST, BALGA.

## Kambarang (Year 2)

Weather starts to get warmer

The yellow flowers continue and many other more delicate flowers appear such as the Kangaroo paw and Orchid.

Blagas start to flower

Moodjar (West Australian Christmas Tree) appears with yellowy oragne flowers

Snakes and reptiles awaken from hibernation

Koolbardies are still protecting their nests

COLOURS - YELLOWS AND BLUES

PICTURES – SWOOPING KOOLBARDIES, SNAKES AND REPTILES, MOODJAR, KANGAROO PAW, FLOWERING BLAGAS

#### Birak (Year 5)

Warm weather starts and the afternoons are cooled with the sea breeze

Traditionally this was the time for mosaic burning, easterly winds in the morning and sea breeze in the afternoon

Moodjar is in full flower with deep orange flowers

Fledglings (baby birds) start to venture out of the nest

Reptiles start to shed their skin

Rising temperatures with decreasing rainfall, frogs complete transformation to adulthood

**COLOURS - ORANGE** 

PICTURES – MOODJAR WITH DEEP ORANGE FLOWERS, BABY BIRDS OUT OF NEST WITH PARENT, REPTILES SHEDDING SKIN, SEA BREEZE, MOSAIC FIRE

The students will be given a small amount of time next term to finish these posters. The final due date will be Friday May 3 (Term 2 Week 3). This may be a great, quiet activity for them to spend time on over the holidays. All posters will be displayed during our NAIDOC celebrations this year.

One poster from each year group will be selected and re-printed on metal to form part of our yarning circle Six Seasons signage.

All students have started their posters. I look forward to seeing some fantastic creations when we return next term!

# Did you know we have a 3-Year-Old Kindy? Enrolments are now open for 4 Year old Kindergarten for 2025 and 2026



We are now accepting enrolments for kindy for 2025 and 2026. Make sure you get enrolment forms in as soon as possible as positions are limited and interviews for the 2025 intake will commence in April 2024.

If your child was born between **1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021** they will start 4 Year Old Kindergarten at the beginning of **2025**. If your child was born between **1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022** they will start 4 Year Old Kindergarten in **2026**.

St Brigid's College awards Scholarships for entry to Years 7 and 10 with the intention of assisting students to maximise their potential. The Scholarships are open to all students who are due to start Year 7 or Year 10 in 2025.

St Brigid's College also supports families who might not otherwise be able to afford a Catholic education for their child by providing scholarship monies to partially affray fees. In these instances, means testing will apply.

The College participates in the ACER (Australian Council for Educational Research) Scholarship Selection Test (SST). Scholarships are awarded on academic merit and on an interview with the Scholarship Committee. Candidates must sit for the ACER exam. For entry into Year 7, 2025 and Year 10, 2025, the ACER exam will be held on **Monday, 15th April 2024**.
